

Adani at a Glance - Know the Facts

YOU MIGHT HAVE HEARD A BIT ABOUT ADANI. BUT HOW MUCH DO YOU REALLY KNOW?

Did you know Adani is a globally integrated infrastructure and energy business covering ports and logistics, power generation including cleaner thermal and renewable energy generation, power transmission, agribusiness as well as resources?

Spanning India, Asia and now Australia, a snapshot of Adani's business includes:

- India's largest commercial port developer with 10 Ports and terminals including India's largest port at Mundra.
- India's largest private sector power producer with an installed capacity of cleaner thermal and renewables over 12,000MW growing to 20,000MW by 2020.
- India's largest private rail operator.
- A transmission business operating 5,000 km of transmission lines with 1,650 under development.
- Mining in India and Indonesia with the Galilee projects under development in Australia.
- Gas distribution including cleaner natural gas fuels like compressed natural gas and liquefied natural gas.
- Food and agri-business including edible oils, fruit and vegetables and agri-logistics.

Part of India's massive economic growth story, Adani has now made the single largest investment from India into Australia to date, setting the foundations for a strong trade opportunity between our two countries.

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

Did you know Adani makes a significant investment in the communities it operates?

Through the Adani Foundation and other investments, Adani operates and supports schools, hospitals and clinics.

It might not sound like much in Australia, but how many businesses invest in things like?

• Education:

- 5 directly subsidised schools like the Adani Public School in Mundra.
- Additional support to 543 government aided schools.
- Three Adani Vidya Mandirs school sites providing opportunities for 1800 gifted students from economically challenged backgrounds to develop pathways out of poverty.
- Investment in Early Childhood Education.

· Health:

- G.K General Hospital and Adani Hospital at Mundra.
- Seven mobile healthcare units attending 13,500 patients a month.
- 13 rural clinics supporting 60,000 patients a year.
- a special senior citizens health card scheme initiated.
- Gujarat Institute of Medical Science private public partnership with the state of Gujarat training 750 doctors and offering 700 patient beds.
- Hygiene, sanitation and clean water
 - Toilets to every household in 28 communities.
 - 81 km of drainage across 18 villages.
 - Water conservation measures.

And of course, by providing more affordable, cleaner power as part of India's massive program to lift hundreds of millions of people without power out of poverty, Adani's vertically integrated Australian projects won't just provide 10,000 direct and indirect Australian jobs it will help lift 100 million people out of energy poverty.

DID YOU KNOW?

- India is the world's fastest growing economy, set to be the worlds largest consumer market by 2025 and the largest population in the world within a decade. A massive trade opportunity for Australia.
- Adani's Galilee projects have already invested over \$3 billion in Australia, the largest Indian investment to date.

CLEANER POWER IS HELPING THE POOR

Hundreds of millions in India have no electricity and rely on polluting and poisonous open biomass fires, open coal fires and kerosene for their basic needs. The World Health Organisation has indicated that this biomass exposure is the equivalent of smoking two packets of cigarettes a day.

That's why projects that provide the cleaner thermal and solar electricity that Australians take for granted, are so important. For world poverty, supporting massive growth and increase in energy consumption and contributing to international efforts on climate change.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Adani and its Australian projects are contributing to the world efforts on Climate.
- Cleaner thermal coal technologies like Adani's supercritical and ultrasupercritical thermal generators are lower emitting than Australia's generating fleet.
- Along with Adani's significant solar investment, including the world's largest single site solar generator near Madurai, this will help India meet its commitment to Paris Plus, a significant commitment to the world effort to reduce emissions.
